

CYBERSECURITY COURSES IN ALL UNIVERSITIES SOON, GUV SAYS

Maharashtra's governor CP Radhakrishnan on Sunday announced plans to introduce short-term cybersecurity courses across all universities in the state. Speaking at the Cyber Education for Cyber Security Awards event, the governor, who is also the chancellor of state-run universities, revealed that he will soon convene a meeting with the vice-chancellors (VCs) of all the universities to discuss the development and implementation of these courses, which he said would be aimed at 'creating a new gen

eration of cyber warriors.'

Highlighting the growing importance of cybersecurity in an increasingly digital world, Radhakrishnan stressed that these courses would equip students with the necessary skills to tackle cyber threats and contribute to a safer online environment. "These short-term courses will serve as a training ground for the next generation of cybersecurity experts, ensuring that we stay ahead in this critical area," the governor said.

The governor's announcement comes at a time when cyber threats are on rise in state. By integrating cybersecurity education into mainstream university curricula, Radhakrishnan hopes to prepare students to combat the growing threat of online crimes.
